

# Introduction

Do we practice psychotherapy inside the frame of specific cultural codes?

Do French practitioners work with different sensibilities, structures and constraints to their UK counterparts?

What are the goals and limits of the psychoanalytic supervision dialogue?

These are some of questions that will be answered at this unique opportunity to learn from 4 of the most innovative thinkers in French psychoanalysis as they work one-to-one with a UK colleague in the form of a live supervision session. Together they will consider the difficulties being faced in a piece of previously unseen clinical work and explore what breakthroughs in the treatment might emerge from the fresh perspective being offered.

The evenings will begin with introductions by both supervisor and supervisee to their psychoanalytic theoretical orientation and clinical approach. The supervisee will give us background to the case in question, which will be heavily disguised to protect the identity of the patient. This will be followed by an hour-long supervision session, with time at the end for questions and discussion.

The evenings are being held in English.

# Speakers

**9 January 2004**

**Marie-Hélène Brousse**

After studying philosophy in the Sorbonne I began a personal analysis which led me to an analytical training carried out within the framework of the Clinical Section of the University of Paris VIII, where I did a Doctorate in Psychoanalysis on "The mother-child relationship in psychoanalysis". I then completed a Diploma in Clinical Psychopathology at the University of Rennes. Having worked from 1976 to 1997 as a consultant psychoanalyst at the Sainte-Anne Hospital in Paris, I am presently a senior teacher at the Jacques Lacan Unit within the psychiatric hospital at Yerres. I have belonged, since its formation, to the Ecole de la Cause Freudienne, and I am a Member of the Council of the World Association of Psychoanalysis. I am currently the President of the European School of Psychoanalysis, within which I have founded an anglophone network. I have published many articles and book chapters, the latest being on "a difficulty in women's analysis". I am the Editor of the *Journal Mental*, whose field is therapeutics and mental health, and which can be consulted in English on the internet.

**27 February 2004**

**André Green**

Dr André Green is a psychoanalyst who lives and works in Paris. He is Past-President of the Paris Psycho-Analytical Society. He also served as Director of the Paris Psychoanalytic Institute and as Vice-President of the International Psychoanalytic Association. In addition, he has been co-editor of the *International Journal of Psycho-Analysis*, *The International Review of Psycho-Analysis*, and *Nouvelle Revue de Psychoanalyse*. He has written several books, which include *The Tragic Effect*, *On Private Madness*, and *The Fabric of Affect in the Psychoanalytic Discourse*.

**26 March 2004**

**François Lévy**

François Lévy initially qualified in Psychopathology and Clinical Psychology. He went on to work as a psychotherapist at the Clinique de La Borde, founded by Dr Jean Oury, and then at the Ecole Expérimentale de Bonneuil, founded by Maud Mannoni for autistic children. He is a founder member and "membre actif" (full member) of the Société de Psychoanalyse Freudienne, a psychoanalyst and training psychoanalyst. He is author of numerous articles, Editor of the psychoanalytic review *Les Lettres de la Société de Psychoanalyse Freudienne*. He runs two clinical-theoretical courses, one on Bion's theory, the other on the paternal function (together with Gianna Williams at the Tavistock Clinic, London).

**7 May 2004**

**Philippe Porret**

Philippe Porret PhD is a clinical psychologist and psychoanalyst practicing in Grenoble. He has a special interest in the treatment of psychological issues arising in pregnancy and in psychoanalytical approaches to understanding infertility. He is an active Member of the *Societe de Psychanalyse Freudienne*. He has written numerous articles on fantasy and on paranoia, published in *Psychanalyse l'université, L'evolution Psychiatrique, Esquisses Psychoanalytiques, Journal des Psychologues*, and the *Bulletin de Psychologie*. He has also written about supervision, poetry, *What Psychoanalysts Still owe to Poetry*, contemporary art (with Annabelle Gugnion in *Beaux-Arts* magazine) and has contributed to a collective book by analysts (including Jeanine Chasseguet-Smirguel and Michele Montrelay) entitled *The Invention of Feminine* (Ed. Campagne-Premire). He is currently writing a biography of the outstanding psychoanalyst Dr Joyce McDougall.
